Trust donors to help 12 students this year



The UKZN UK Trust is providing assistance to 12 needy students at the University in 2013 through its bursaries and the Margaret Thomas Scholarship – thanks to donations from alumni and supporters.

This is no mean achievement but pressure on the charity's finances continues to reduce the number of bursaries we can provide. With less money available this year, the Trustees regret that the number of students being given support is one down on last year.

The needs of many poor students remain acute and we have been unable to offer help for many deserving cases. One such is a secondyear Bachelor of Nursing student who comes from a family of seven with

a total income equivalent to less than £800 a year. She has done well in her studies and has had very good grades, averaging 73%. Unfortunately we have been unable to include her on this year's list of students



Your donations make possible the continuing education of students such as this who aspire to qualifications that will ensure their future employment and benefit the society as a whole. The Trustees urge donors and supporters to give as generously as you can.



Good response to appeal for e-mail addresses

The Trustees have welcomed the level of submissions of e-mail addresses in response to the call made in the previous issue of Trust News and wish to thank all those alumni who have made sure that the Trust and the University's Alumni Affairs Office have a current e-mail address for them.

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Margaret Thomas Scholar Nxumalo among students thanking donors for assistance

The Trustees have been pleased to receive messages of thanks from students who received the Trust's help in 2012, particularly a letter from Siyabonga Nxumalo who was awarded the Margaret Thomas Scholarship.

Siyabonga, a Bachelor of Arts student, writes that the Scholarship "not only reduced the financial strain that disadvantaged students like myself are always faced with but ... revived my passion to be resourceful and extend a helpful hand towards those communities that are still denied a right to basic needs".

He speaks of his interest in the courses he has been studying – including Philosophy, Classical Civilization, Politics and the Media, and Cultural Studies – saying they have advanced his analytical skills. He believes he is strongly placed to investigate social ills and address them with possible solutions.

Siyabonga plans to work to help rural and semi-rural communities in developing self-dependence through wider access to forms of subsistence and commercially viable production: "I believe this will eradicate food shortage and lack of basic needs that are fundamental to communities' well-being."

The Trustees recently awarded the Scholarship to Senamile Ngobese, a Bachelor of Social Science student, for 2013.

Five students have had their bursaries renewed for this year, including Ayanda Simelane and Sithuliso Ntshangase, Bachelor of Education students who featured in the previous issue of Trust News.
